\$2,500 of Suspected Methamphetamine Seized by Guam Customs

BARRIGADA, Guam – October 22, 2015 – The Guam Customs & Quarantine Agency (CQA) agents working in the Guam International Airport Authority inspection area seized approximately 5.2 gross grams of suspected crystal methamphetamine.

A twenty-six year old male, Yu-Yang Lin, aboard China Air flight 026 originating from Taipei and arriving in Guam at 4:00AM has been detained for importation of suspected crystal methamphetamine.

A search conducted by a CQA officer revealed drug paraphernalia within a checked bag with what appeared to be an illegal substance residue. Further inspection revealed a crystal-like substance found on his person in the amount of 5.2 gross grams.

A field test was conducted which yielded a presumptive positive result for the presence of methamphetamine. The narcotics are worth approximately \$2,500.

“This seizure was possible with the cooperation between U.S. Customs and Border Protection officers and CQA,” said the lead lieutenant of the case. “Continued cooperation between Guam Customs and our federal counterparts will ensure the safety of our borders and our island.”

The case has been forwarded to the Office of the Attorney General for prosecution.
